ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES AT INNISDALE

After receiving a gold standing from Ontario Ecoschools in the beginning of 2017, Innisdale is once again motivated to continue moving forward with green initiatives and sustainability. October 16-22 is Simcoe County's Waste Reduction Week. During this time, Innisdale will be promoting waste minimization strategies and completing a waste audit. In addition to the regular recycling program, Innisdale currently offers GOOS paper options (good on one side paper), used pen recycling bins, dead battery collection, and a toner recycling program. Students can contribute to our waste minimization strategy by utilizing these programs as well as considering garbage-less lunches, reusable containers, and trying to ensure that waste produced (including recycling) is put into the proper receptacles.

COMPUTER OPERATED VOICE MESSAGING SYSTEM

SchoolConnects is a support tool Innisdale uses to communicate daily attendance. You should receive a message home if your son/daughter has an unexplained absence. Currently all calls go to the main home phone line. If you would like that number changed, please come into the school and speak to an administrator.

TRYING TO CONTACT A TEACHER?

When phoning teachers at Innisdale you have the option to go directly to their voicemail by **entering their 5 digit extension number or pressing 2 and spelling the teacher's last name**. For the letters Q and Z use 0(zero) on the telephone keypad. (Call the office for the correct spelling of the teacher's name.) Email is another method of contacting teachers. Most teachers put their email addresses on their first day handouts. The Voice Mail Extension List can be located under the "Contact Us" tab on Innisdale's website www.innisdale.ca.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE - Convenient Safe Secure

Pay for activity fees, field trips, etc. with SchoolCash Online

The SchoolCash Online program is now available at all schools, offering parents the option to pay online for field trips and other items. The program is intended to reduce paper, eliminate the need for students to travel with money, and for money to be counted and stored at schools. Payment by credit card has now also been added. Parents who sign up will receive a notification when a new item becomes available for purchase. Items are personalized to each student. Parents will use a secure online account to process payments, and can either make a one-time payment for each item as it occurs, or load money to carry a balance in the online account to make payments in the future.

TAKE OUR KIDS TO WORK - NOVEMBER 1, 2017

Grade 9 students across the province will be involved in job shadowing on Wednesday, November 1st, 2017. This is an excellent opportunity for young people to see what day-to-day work is like for their parent, and help students begin thinking about how their schooling will lead to employment. Permission forms will be given out in gr. 9 homerooms. Parents are asked to check with their own employer to determine if their child will be able to attend the work site **to observe** for the day. If so, a permission form is completed and returned to the school. If not, parents should check with a relative or friend to see if their child could attend an alternative work site to observe. Similar paperwork is required. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure that the work place will be safe for their child to attend. Appropriate clothing and behavioural expectations should be reviewed with students. Please note that it is expected that the student will be an observer, not a worker, as the employer does not usually provide health and safety orientation for this observation day. There will be no regular programming for Grade 9 classes at Innisdale on November 1st. Assigned study space will be provided for those students who do not go to work with their parents. All students in Grades 10-12 will be expected to attend classes as usual.

POST SECONDARY INFORMATION



Grade 12's will be invited to post-secondary information sessions.

Those interested in heading to university should attend the assembly on October 11th during period 1 and those interested in college destinations should go to the period 2 assembly. In these periods guidance counsellors will review how to research pre-requisites needed for programs, how to apply and where to look for scholarship options.

In response to the increasing wait times for child and youth mental health services, and the increased need for such services, New Path has undertaken a service redesign that will provide more timely and responsive services to children, youth and families in Simcoe County. New Path now offers Child and Youth Mental Health Walk-In Clinics in five office locations throughout Simcoe County: Bradford, Alliston, Barrie, Collingwood and Orillia.

Children, youth and families requesting service from New Path no longer need to call and complete an intake; they can simply attend one of the local Walk-In Clinics and will receive a single session intervention that day. Should children or youth require further service, New Path will continue to offer a wide variety of community and school-based services as well as residential service and women's service.
